Students from all nine Baltic Sea countries are invited to join in this authentic experience where they will take part in workshops, conduct research and connect to like-minded individuals.

The little island of Årø, off of the east coast of Denmark, will be hosting the endeavour and will be our home and research base during the week-long stay.

About us

The Robert-Bosch-Gesamtschule is a UNESCO school which approaches education in a holistic manner. To this end we have been hosting summer school projects on Årø for over 25 years and now it's time to go international!

As a member of the Baltic Sea Project we seek to raise awareness and strive for a better environment in the Baltic Sea region. A key factor to solving some of the environmental problems is education. This includes providing students with an understanding of the scientific, social and cultural aspects surrounding the independence of man and nature.



Our Objective

We aim to provide approximately 60 students, aged 16-19, with the opportunity to extend their knowledge about the Baltic Sea region by taking them out of a typical school environment and educating them in a setting which provides authentic interdisciplinary topics. We hope to spark their interest in making a difference in their homes, schools and communities becoming world citizens with a sense of responsibility and the necessary self-confidence to make a difference in this world.

What to Expect

Students and teachers will arrive at a camp that is equipped to host 70-80 people in 12 large sleeping tents, a fully equipped outdoor kitchen and several tents large enough to conduct research and present results to the entire group.

Students will spend part of their day working on a research project in a group. Additionally they will have the opportunity to visit various workshops giving them insight into research about and surrounding the region. Furthermore, students will take part in free time activities such as an afternoon boating tour, roasted marshmallows over the evening bonfire or stargazing at midnight.
